

She has consulted for service dogs at the Tampa International Airport, the Gainsville Regional Airport, several police departments, the Florida Department of Transportation and participated with therapists for psychiatric care of victims following tragedies. She is a noted speaker having appeared before many national and local organizations.

Ms. Borden has received multiple national awards and donated over 300 service dogs to date. National statistics report that 20-22 Veterans commit suicide daily for a total of 8000 per year. Carol is proud of her success of placing nearly 300 Paired Teams over 10 years resulting in "O" suicides.
