

Carol Borden is the Founder and CEO of Guardian Angels Medical Service Dogs, Inc. She has spent years managing big box stores and decades training dogs. She is a licensed American Kennel Club dog handler and an approved Canine Good Citizen Evaluator with the American Kennel Club.

She has taught hundreds of obedience classes and competed with her dogs in dozens of dog events. She had developed a service dog training curriculum which has been accredited by the Florida Department of Education. Service dogs trained under her curriculum have been approved to work for the Department of Defense. She has consulted for service dogs at the Tampa International Airport, the Gainsville Regional Airport, several police departments, the Florida Department of Transportation and participated with therapists for psychiatric care of victims following tragedies. She is a noted speaker having appeared before many national and local organizations.

Ms. Borden has received multiple national awards and donated over 300 service dogs to date. National statistics report that 20-22 Veterans commit suicide daily for a total of 8000 per year. Carol is proud of her success of placing nearly 300 Paired Teams over 10 years resulting in "O" suicides.
