PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Heat Continues. It seems like it has become especially hot this summer on Marco Island. I've only lived here since 2012, but it really seems (to me) that the summers feel hotter than my first year or two on the island. Maybe it's that we're aging, or maybe it's actually hotter than before, or maybe both are true. Either way, we have to be careful about how much time we spend in the summer sun and how much effort we expend in outside activities in the heat. We need to limit strenuous outdoor mid-day activities, use sunscreen, stay hydrated, and take refuge indoors if we begin to feel light-headed or ill. Annual Dues. The dues paying cycle is over, and I'm happy to report that our enrollment/re-enrollment numbers remain just about where they were last September.

I'm also happy to report that the online renewal process worked very well for us. More than two-thirds of our members processed and paid their dues on our website using their Visa or MasterCards. This quick and easy way to pay dues is a real convenience to our members and officers and it saves every member using it the time and mailing expense of sending a paper check to the club via US Mail. On the processing end, the system creates a record of the payment that cannot be misplaced (like a paper renewal and check), and a record that can be easily retrieved by the club's officers whenever needed. Checks and mail that slips between the cracks offer no such back-up.

By the way, paying online with a credit card is arguably safer than paying with a paper check by mail. When you pay online the club does not keep your credit card information. And even if some malicious individual does come upon your credit card number, your personal liability is limited by the terms of your credit card agreement - often at \$50 or less - provided you promptly notify the card issuer that someone has misused the card. Credit card theft is not the same as identity theft, and can be remedied much more simply. On the other hand, if someone gets a hold of your check, he or she has access to your bank account number, routing number, address, etc.

In summary, I believe the online payment system is safe and here to stay, and I hope that even more members take advantage of it next year.

August Meeting. Our guest speaker at the August general meeting was **Debra Frenkel** from the **Freedom Waters Foundation**. Debra is the Founder and Executive Director of the Foundation, which was incorporated in 2006. The Foundation is a non-profit that enhances lives by providing boating opportunities and marine related activities for people with disabilities, life-threatening illnesses, youth at risk and others with special needs. Her work has led her to be Chairman of the US Disabled Sailing Championship Committee from 2008-2012. She has been involved in this national regatta since 1999.



SEPTEMBER 2019 LARRY KALKSTEIN THE IMPACT OF WEATHER ON HUMANS

Dr. Larry Ka!kstein received his-Bachelor's degree from Rutgers University and his Masters and Ph.D. degrees from Louisiana State University in climatology with a minor in forestry.

Larry is a bio-climatologist who specializes in the impact of weather on human beings. For the past 40 years he has dealt with weather's impact on heat related illnesses as well as the recommending appropriate sites for power plants to prevent pollution to humans and prevent injury to national parks. He has been the principal investigator and researcher for projects that develop and implement heat/health warning systems for major cities worldwide. His work has led him to collaborate with the United States Environmental Protection Agency, the 3M Company, various NGO's, the los Angeles Urban and Cooling Coilaborative and the Korean government.

Dr. Kaikstein has published over 140 manuscripts, book chapters and monographs. He has served as a professor for 30 Masters students and 10 Ph.D, students, His work has led him to develop numerous weather indices for applied climatology and create air mass-based synoptk classifications to be used worldwide by a variety of climate and health practitioners,

NOVEMBER 2019 FIRE CHIEF PETER HAYDEN FDNY RESPONSE TO 9/11

Peter Hayden retired as Chief of Department of the FDNY after 38 years of service. He retired in 2006. On 9/11 Chief Hayden was the division commander flower Manhattan, an area that covers the world trade center. He was on duty at the time of the attack and supervised operations in the North Tower, the first building hit. After the collapse of World Trade Center Towers, Chief Hayden was promoted to Assistant Chief of Operation and supervised the rescue and recovery operations at "GroundZero":

Chief Hayden will discuss the events of that day and the many months afterward. He will describe damage done to the department, the efforts to rebuild the department and to prepare the FDNY for future terrorist attacks.

DECEMBER 2019 COMO WALTER JASKIEWICZ BOATING SAFETY


