MARCH 2020 GREGORY POLAND, M.D. COVID 19

Dr. Poland graduated from Illinois Wesleyan University and received his medical degree from the Southern Illinois University School of Medicine. He completed his residency in Internal Medicine/Infectious Diseases at the University of Minnesota/Abbot-Northwestern Hospital. He specializes in virology and vaccinology. He is the director of the Mayo Clinic's Vaccine Research Group.

Besides receiving many awards and accolades in the field of immunology, Dr. Poland is the Editor in Chief for the medical journal Vaccine. He has been a member of multiple federal committees and he persuaded the CDC to recommend annual influenza vaccination for all Americans 6 months and older. He was also the initial and primary advocate for requiring influenza immunization for all health care workers. Dr. Poland holds the academic rank of Professor of Medicine and Infectious Diseases and Molecular Pharmacology and Experimental Therapeutics at the Mayo Clinic.
