August 14, 2024 Ed Brandt, Brigadier General United Church of Marco Island

Ed Brandt is the Interim Pastor for United Church of Marco Island. He began the position on May 1 and is an ordained Presbyterian Minister. He retired from the National Guard in 2020 with over 31 years of military service both as a traditional and full-time member of the National Guard. Ed deployed to Iraq from 2008-2009 as a Brigade Chaplain. There, he was responsible for the spiritual welfare of over 1200 soldiers, supervising two Battalion chaplains. He received the Bronze Star for meritorious service.

His military assignments included Division Support Command, Forward Support Battalion, Troop Command, Signal Brigade, Executive Officer, Training Officer, Staff Chaplain, and US Army Deputy Chief of Chaplains, Army National Guard and Chief of Chaplains, National Guard Bureau.

Ed's military service has taken him to Serbia, Czech Republic, Guam, Puerto Rico, and South Korea as well as Alaska, Hawaii, and the majority of the lower 48. In 2019 he was preacher at the Easter Sunrise Service at Arlington National Cemetery and in 2018 delivered the commencement address for the University of Findlay, Findlay, Ohio. He retired in 2020 at the Rank of Brigadier General.

Ed has served pastorates in Pennsylvania, Delaware, California, Michigan, and now Florida. Congregations served range from 50 to 2200 and has served as Solo Pastor and Head of Staff for multiple staff churches.

He is a graduate of Findlay College, Princeton Theological Seminary, and received his doctorate from Lancaster Theological Seminary. He was the first National Guard Chaplain to be appointed to in-residence attendance at the US Army War College.

Ed is active in the community belonging to the Pelican Bay Rotary Club, serving on the Collier Mosquito Control District, various Veterans organizations and numerous regional and national boards. He is married to the former Jane Stewart and together they spoil four granddaughters with three children scattered across the country.


